## VILLAGE HOTEL KATONG



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he thought of vacationing in metropolitan Singapore immediately brings bound hotopola like Orchard Road, Marina Bey Sands and Sentosa Island to mind But if you've lever for a more look experience, it y wilting the quant neighbourhood of Nature in the acutheast of the island.

Before land reclamation on the Sect Coast, Katong was once on the seafront, attracting wealthy foreign settlers to establish estates and plantations there – a mix of outures reflected by the ediectic architectural style of the surviving buildings harmoniously blanding Chinese, colonial and Penanskan (Strato-born Chinese) influences. Now, (t), considered the Eurapian (most European-Asian heritage) and Penanskan hub of Singapore.

Within the vicinity Village Hotel Katong is well-placed – only 10 minutes' walk to most of Katong's popular attractions – to be your base. It shares a historic building with Katong V, a small shopping centre-both extensively refurbished by Fer East Hospitality Attention to detail is exident in the Penansian-influenced discretishing with thoughtful service acti-one like free data-enabled smartphones for guests and a Grab kicok in the lobby.

We went from the hotel to the Joo Chiat area – Singapore's first Heritage Town – for Indagram-worthy shots of the coloural colonial-style shophouses and Peranskan tertace homes, and then took a guided tour of the Eurasian Heritage Centre to learn about their actival in Singapore, World War II and more. Meanwhile, vieto to beautiful stone like Rumah Babe and Katong Antique House gave us girrgase of traditional kebayas, beaded sippers and virtage Peranskan furniture. There's an up-and-coming café scene in Katong, but it's still best known for its traditional fare. We breakfasted on soft-boiled legs and toast with kees (coconut jam') in a Hainanese-style coffeestop, shared a tiny plastic table with the locals to sample creamy Katong lakes for lunch, and made nine-layer shared cake and ondeh-ondeh (glutinous nice table with palm suger) in a Peranskan kueh (cake) appreciation session with popular rice dumping makers kim Choo.

Upon returning to the hotel, we made full use of our Penander Club Lounge access privileges to snack on carapés and sip on cocktais before dimner at Katong Kinther, their halel-certified restaurant. Quality own quantity — everything I sampled from the modest selection was body with the fresh seaf-ood, Katong lakas and satled agg crayfish being definite highlights.

My bright, spacious Peransion Club more on level five (the largest in the category) was a welcome sight to return to. I most enjoyed being a long cosk in the freestanding in-noon bethub while seatching a move on TV. A skiding door separated the bethub and bethnoon, but allowed way access for mining off.

Learing was mentally hard but logistically easy – we took the free hotel shuttle to the airport and were at Terminal 2 in 20 minutes. Since Penansian Club room guests also enjoy two-hour complimentary use of the airport lourge, we had lurch there and took pictures in the sunflower geden before mixing our way to our gate. If you've looking for a luos stay and a down-to-senth Singaporean experience, the Village Katong is a good bet 12
